## California CPORT Pilot Study

SARATSO is considering the use of the Child Pornography Offense Risk Tool (CPORT) as a mandated tool in California. The CPORT is a seven (7) item risk instrument that would be scored by probation or parole during pre-sentencing. The score will provide recidivism probabilities that can be used to guide intensity and dosage of supervision and treatment.

Before adopting the CPORT, the SARATSO Committee will be choosing a handful of interested counties to participate in the CPORT Pilot Program. Counties who participate will be trained to score the CPORT, and work closely with SARATSO staff to identify any barriers or problems that arise when scoring the instrument.

A recruitment flyer was distributed to Chiefs of Probation on December 9, 2022. Updates will be provided during quarterly SARATSO meetings.

## GEARS: Does Your Client Have a Missing or Incorrect CII Number?

If your client is missing or has an incorrect CII number, the following steps should be taken to obtain the information:

1. Review the client's RAP Sheet. If you do not have access to the RAP sheet, you may request it from the client's Probation Department. Clinicians have a legal right to access the RAP sheet to score risk assessments per the Penal Code.
2. Contact the client's supervising probation officer or parole agent. They should have this information readily available.
3. *As a last resort*, you may ask your client to speak with their Registration Officer to obtain the CII number.

The Supervision Agreement Form, for Associate and Student level providers, must be thoroughly reviewed and completed in full. This form is composed of *two pages*, and can be found within the CASOMB Online Application. As a requirement of CASOMB, applicants must complete this form to best of their abilities prior to submitting the application to begin the review process.

## Certification Application - Training Hours

When entering training dates and hours within the CASOMB application, please list the completion date and accurate number of hours in full.

For example, if attending a multi-day training, please list the *final day of the training* as the training completion date, and the *total number of hours* (i.e., *Stable/Acute Basic is 14 total hours over two days of instruction*).

## Upcoming Presentation: Cognitive Behavioral Intervention Sex Offender (CBI-SO) In-Prison Treatment Program

At the January 2023 CASOMB Meeting, the CBI-SO program staff will be presenting to the Board. The CBI-SO is a pilot program which provides Cognitive Behavioral Treatment programming to address the criminogenic needs of incarcerated individuals who are required to register pursuant to Penal Code section 290 (PC 290). The focus of CBI-SO Program is to increase public safety by reducing criminal behavior and recidivism for incarcerated individuals who will be mandated to participate in community-based treatment programs upon release.
